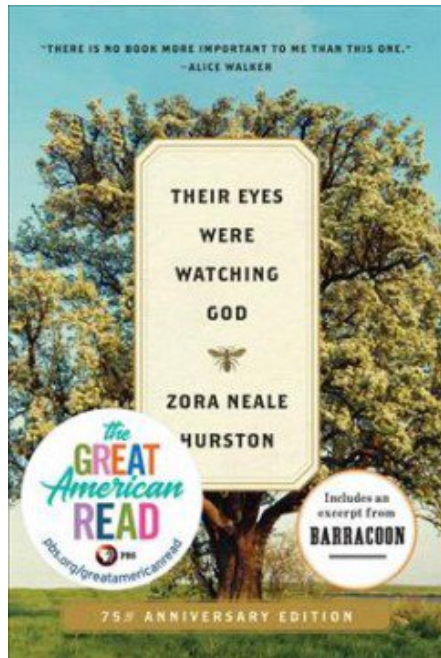

"This was out of print for almost thirty years due to public rejection of its strong black female protagonist. Since its 1978 reissue, Hurston's classic has become one of the most widely read and highly acclaimed novels in the canon of African-American literature."

Zora Neale Hurston (1891–1960): American author, anthropologist, and filmmaker. She portrayed racial inequities in the early-20th-century South and her struggles as an African-American woman. She was a central figure of the Harlem Renaissance. She wrote more than 50 short stories, plays, and essays. Hurston was awarded a Guggenheim Fellowship to conduct ethnographic research in Jamaica and Haiti.
